In addition to showcasing the variety of programs and place the department offers residents and visitors, this event will also give our community partners an opportunity to highlight their "playful" sides as well. Latchkey After School

The Latchkey After School Program is the answer for working parents concerned about leaving their children in unsupervised environments. It is an enrichment program licensed by the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services.

The program operates Monday through Friday from the end of the school day until 6:00 p.m. at 36 elementary school sites within Corpus Christi, Calallen and Flour Bluff Independent School Districts. Children who attend schools that do not offer the Latchkey program can register at any Latchkey site with the understanding that parents are responsible for making transportation arrangements.

The program provides a safe, supervised environment, and quality recreational experiences and activities including art, drama, games and special events. Tuition assistance is available for qualified participants. All qualifying sites will be provided with snacks through a grant with the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Special Nutrition Program. 

Private Swim Lessons

Private swim lessons are available Monday–Friday evenings at the Natatorium, per instructor availability. Cancellations made less than 24 hours in advance will not be rescheduled. You may reschedule one session per four-lesson package. Fee: \$10.00/30-minute lesson OR \$35.00/4-pack of 30-minute lessons. Call the Natatorium for more information.

Agua Fitness

Held in shallow water at the Natatorium, this class is great for improving flexibility and strengthening your core. Classes are held Monday/Wednesday/Friday, 6pm–7pm for all participants, age 14 and up. Lifeguards are always on duty. Fee is \$4.00/class or \$24.00/8-class punch card.

Water Safety Instructor Course

Purpose: Prepares instructor candidates to organize and conduct courses in swimming and water safety, including Learn-to-Swim, Parent and Child Aquatics, Basic Water Rescue, and Water Safety Presentations.

Prerequisites: Minimum age of 16, swim 25 yards each of the following at a Level 4 ability: front crawl, back crawl, sidestroke, breaststroke and elementary backstroke, swim 15 yards of butterfly, maintain position on back for 1 minute in deep water, tread water for 1 minute

Cost: \$175; fee includes instructor's manual

Duration: 30 hours

Class: December 20–23, 2009, 9am–5pm each day. Instructor Candidates must attend all sessions to achieve certification.

Course Notes: Course includes Fundamentals of Instructor Training.

Lifeguard Instructor Course

Purpose: Trains lifeguarding instructor candidates to teach American Red Cross Lifeguarding course, CPR for the Professional Rescuer, First Aid, Automated External Defibrillation, Oxygen Administration and Bloodborne Pathogens Training. **Prerequisites:** Minimum age of 17. Correctly answer at least 80% of the questions in each of the three final written Lifeguarding exams. Must swim 300 yards continuously using these strokes in the following order: 100 yards of front crawl stroke, 100 yards of breaststroke and 100 yards of either front crawl or breaststroke or a combination of both. All 300 yards must use rhythmic breathing with your face in the water and a stabilizing, propellant kick. Swim 20 yards using front crawl or breaststroke, surface dive to a minimum depth of 7 feet, retrieve a 10 lb. object, return to surface, and swim back to starting point with the object within one minute and forty seconds. When returning to the starting point, you must hold the 10 lb. object with both hands and keep your face above the water. Demonstrate competency in First Aid scenarios. Demonstrate competency in CPR/PR/AED scenarios. Demonstrate competency in all water rescue skill and scenarios.

Cost: \$175; fee includes book and materials

Duration: 35 hours

Class: December 27-31, 2009, 9am-5pm each day. Lifeguard Instructor

Candidates must attend all sessions to achieve certification.

Course Notes: Course includes Fundamentals of Instructor Training.

Lifeguard Training

Purpose: Teaches the duties and responsibilities of lifeguards to prevent and respond to aquatic emergencies and procedures to carry them out in a professional manner. Certifies participant as an American Red Cross Lifeguard. Includes certifications in CPR for the Professional Rescuer, First Aid, Automated External Defibrillation, Oxygen Administration, and Bloodborne Pathogens Training. **Prerequisites:** Minimum age of 15 (must be age 16 to work for the City of Corpus Christi). Must swim 300 yards continuously using these strokes in the following order: 100 yards of front crawl stroke, 100 yards of breaststroke and 100 yards of either front crawl or breaststroke or a combination of both. All 300 yards must use rhythmic breathing with your face in the water and a stabilizing, propellant kick. Swim 20 yards using front crawl or breaststroke, surface dive to a minimum depth of 7 feet, retrieve a 10 lb. object, return to surface, and swim back to starting point with the object within one minute and forty seconds. When returning to the starting point, you must hold the 10 lb. object with both hands and keep you face above water.

Cost: \$150; fee includes Lifeguarding Book and a pocket mask.

Duration: 35 hours

Class: November 23–25, 2009, December 19–23, 2009, March 18–21, 2009, and April 17 & 18, and 24 & 25, 2010, 9am–5pm each day. Lifeguard Candidates must attend all sessions to achieve certification.

Weed & Seed Program

The Corpus Christi Parks & Recreation Department's Weed & Seed program is a comprehensive, multi-agency approach to combating violent crime, drug use, and gang activity in high-crime neighborhoods. The program is funded by the Department of Justice (DOJ).

The Weed & Seed Program would like to inform the residents in the Flour Bluff Community that we have been given Official Recognition from the Department of Justice for the new Corpus Christi South East Site.

Four Major Strategies:

The Law Enforcement Strategy is

designed to reduce drug trafficking, drug related crimes, transient and victimless crimes from targeted high crime areas through coordination of efforts of local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies.

The Community Policing Strategy

is designed to focus on increasing police visibility and developing cooperative relationships between the police and the citizens.

The Prevention, Intervention and Treatment Strategy provides adult guidance and youth services through the utilization of Safe Havens in the impacted neighborhoods.

The Neighborhood Restoration Strategy involves federal, state, local and private sector resources to help revitalize distressed neighborhoods through economic development, revitalization efforts, and by providing economic and educational opportunities for residents.

WEED & SEED BEST PRACTICES: Safe Haven

A Safe Haven is a multi-service center where a variety of youth and adult services are coordinated in a highly visible, accessible facility that is secure against crime and illegal drug activity. It is a place where youth and families can access needed services, develop relationships, and find opportunities to be productive, successful and enhance their skills. Our Safe Haven sites have provided an impetus for hope within the community by combating the negative environment. Key Safe Haven Principles:

SEEDTECH, Computer Training

SEEDTECH is a joint initiative between the Department of Justice, Weed & Seed and the National Urban Technology Center (UTC) in partnership with Safe Havens all across the country. SEEDTECH is a fully equipped, state-ofthe-art computer center for community residents. The Corpus Christi Weed & Seed Program established two centers in the Flour Bluff community. One is at Timon's Ministry, 10501 SPID, 361-937-6396 and the other is at the Goodwill Industries of South Texas, 10209 SPID, 361-884-4068. They were created to better prepare community residents with the technological skills they will need to compete in the job market of the 21st century.

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) is a partnership with the Weed & Seed program and the IRS. We enlist volunteers to prepare and e-file income tax for anyone who makes less than \$49,000 per year. This is a free service and we are always looking for volunteers to be trained to help their community. Please call if you would like to help.

Adventure Trekker

Adventure Trekkers is a FREE adventure-based outdoor recreation program designed to provide youth ages 11 to 16 with an opportunity to learn about the natural, environmental, and cultural resources available in Texas and the Coastal Bend Region. 

THE 4 STAGES OF THE DROUGHT PLAN



The City's first Drought Contingency Plan was adopted in 1996 to manage limited water resources during periods of prolonged periods of drought weather conditions. The four percentage levels are based on the combined reservoir level for Choke Canyon Reservoir and Lake Corpus Christi. The percentage level identifies actions that must be implemented by local and regional water users.



50% CITY WIDE VOLUNTARY WATER CONSERVATION


- Municipal operations begin mandatory conservation

You can help extend our water supply by conserving water every day. Nearly 500,000 people in the seven county Coastal Bend area are dependent on water from the Choke Canyon and Lake Corpus Christi Reservoir System and Lake Texana. Communities that buy water from the City of Corpus Christi include Alice, Kingsville, Port Aransas, Aransas Pass, Ingleside, Portland, Taft, Gregory, Rockport, Fulton, Odem, Mathis, Three Rivers, Banquete, Aqua Dulce, Bishop and Ricardo.
